

Instructions for wear checks of play equipment

Checks depend on the kind of equipment. Any equipment with moving parts must be checked at least twice a year, static equipment at least once a year.

Intervals for maintenance work and checks generally depend on:

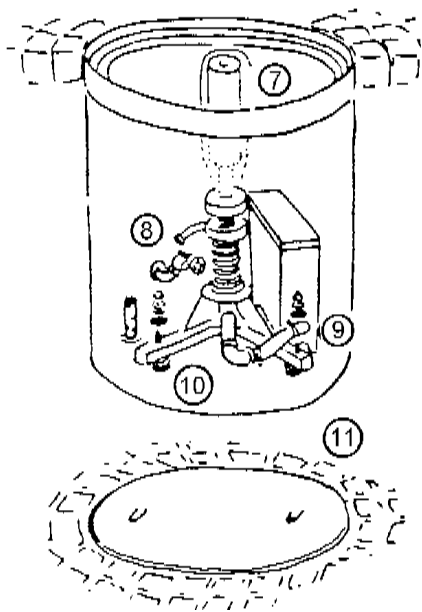
- location
- kind of use
- frequency of use
- possible vandalism

Water Jet

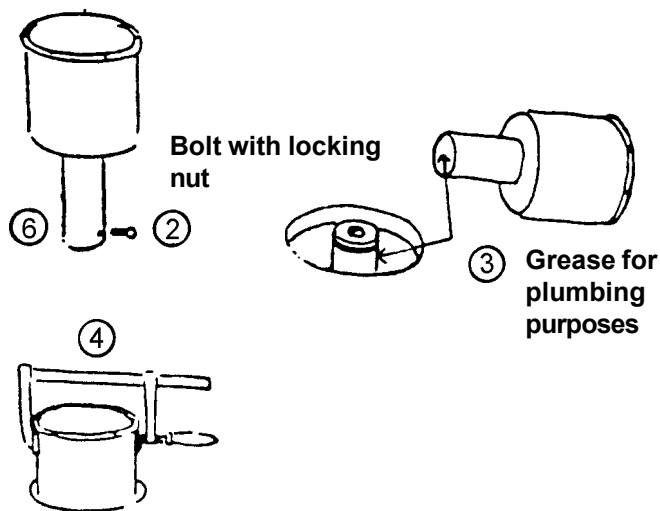

The water jet must always be filled with water in order to flush out sand continuously during playing.



1. The lid must be taken off the well using a timber beam and 2 wire loops. Take care not to damage the standing plate. For this job 2 workers are required.

2. Loosen the locking nut, remove the bolt and pull off the standing plate.
3. Clean both the piston and the cylinder if necessary. Apply special grease suitable for plumbing purposes. **Do not use ordinary lubricant.**
4. If the water jet is on a supervised playground, the standing plate may be fitted without bolt and locking nut. In this case it is possible to pull off the standing plate using a screw clamp. At the bottom of the equipment is a drainage hole by which sand can be flushed out.

5. Empty the water tank after shutting the connection to the water mains.
6. After lifting off the lid (see point 1) pull off the standing plate.
7. Wrap the piston in plastic foil and loosen the pipe clips.
8. Loosen the 3 nuts of the support (19 mm) and the screws of the water tank (13 mm), lift the water jet out of the well.
9. Flush out sand and sediment. Cover the well with the supplied lid without hole for the winter season.
10. If more than one water jet are installed on a site, both well and water jet are marked with red dots. Pay attention to these marks when reinstalling the water jets in springtime.
